The total number of bags collected was 28, 10 of which were tin, plastic and glass for recycling so saved from landfill.

An assortment of larger and 'odder' items: 4 footballs, 2 shopping baskets, set of tent pegs, shoes x 12 (no pairs), new looking crowbar, a saucepan, a functioning fishing lure and a "No Photography" sign were recovered.
